from Donald and Barbara Berg of Decorah, who are serving as our host & hostess for the meeting.

It would be good if everyone could arrive in town on Friday Evening to get settled in your place of lodging and for a social gettogether. That way we will be all ready to start about 8:30 a. m. on Saturday to allow plenty of time for all the activities that have been planned for the day. The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church has invited the Psalmodikon players to participate in their 5:30 p. m. service on Saturday evening and again on Sunday during the 9:30 a. m. service.

The Psalmodikon and I have had a very busy summer. We have been invited to so many special ethnic events and have met hundreds of wonderful people. In June we participated in two church services conducted in

the Norwegian language at the Hjemkomst Center in Moorhead, Minnesota. This Museum houses the Hjemkomst ship that was built by a farmer in the nearby community and then sailed to Norway upon completion. A Stave church, modeled after the church in Vik, Norway, has been built next to the Museum by another local resident, Guy Paulson. The Psalmodikon music sounds wonderful in this huge wooden church although the Stave churches were in use long before the "birth" of the Psalmodikon. Mr. Paulson was quite fascinated with the Psalmodikon and now those strong hands that built the majestic Stave church is now building a Psalmodikon! We welcome Guy and Bev Paulson into the membership of the Nordi-American Psalmodikonforbundet!

The three days during the Nordic Fest in Decorah are usually the highlight of the year but a very tiring one as well. I demonstrated in the Bethania Church, on the Vesterheim grounds, from 9:00 to 5:00 on Friday and Saturday, and then taking a break to perform on the stage at the Viking Theater each afternoon. 



Janne and some of his group were guests at the home of Beatrice one evening and had an enjoyable time of playing Psalmodikon music and catching up on the latest happenings with the Psalmodikon.

When Beatrice attended the meeting of Psalmodidon players in Ostervala, the group coming from Lillehammer, NORWAY had practised a song for their American guest. In the words of Martensson, that melody is now known as the "International Song" of the Psalmodikon!

NORWEGIAN EMIGRANT MUSEUM OTTESTAD, NORWAY

Last Spring when Beatrice Hole was doing a Psalmodikon program for the NORDMANNS-FORBUNDET, Minneapolis Chapter, there was a fellow in the audience from **The Norwegian Emigrant Museum** in Ottestad, Norway. (Near Hammer). The mission of Knut Djupedal to the United States was to gather items for this museum. This is Norway's only museum devoted solely to collecting, preserving and disseminating knowledge of the Norwegian migration to overseas destinations.

The upshot of Knut's conversation with Beatrice was that he was so impressed by our efforts to carry on the Psalmodikon tradition that he asked that we provide the Museum with the written history of the Psalmodikon as well as a Psalmodikon instrument.

Paul Knivsland has constructed a Psalmodikon for that purpose and Beatrice is now rosemaling on it before sending it on to Norway for display in the museum.

An idea by some of the members of the Psalmodikonforbundet is that it would be nice if we could "donate" this Psalmodikon to the Museum thereby receiving recognition as an active Psalmodikon organization here in the United States.

The Psalmodikon that is being sent to the Norwegian Emigrant Museum will be on display during the meeting of the Nordic-American Psalmodkonforbundet in Decorah. We will discuss at that time more of the details of how we can donate the Psalmodikon to the Museum.


